



VIDEO COMPETITION RULES – Hui-World Project – Erasmus+ Programme

Hui-World Project – Erasmus+ Programme

Article 1 – Organisation of the Contest

This contest is organised within the framework of the European **Hui-World** project, funded by the Erasmus+ Programme.

The purpose of this contest is to promote students' learning achievements through the creation of an educational video related to the learning units studied within the project.

Article 2 – Conditions of Participation

The contest is open to students enrolled in the Hui-World programme.

Participation must take place exclusively in groups of **3 to 5 students**.

Members of the jury must have **no direct link** with the participating students.

Participation in the contest implies full and unconditional acceptance of these rules.

Article 3 – Topic

The topic of the video is freely chosen by the students, provided that it is **related to one of the learning units studied** within the framework of the project.

Article 4 – Participation Details

4.1 Required Format

- A video with a maximum duration of **5 minutes**
- Produced by the students
- Complying with these official rules
- Videos can be made in English or in the native language of the students. If the video is made in another language than English, subtitles are mandatory.

4.2 Submission Procedure



Videos must be uploaded on the Youtube Channel of the school and then shared with the Hui-World project through this form :

Any submission made after the deadline will not be considered.

4.3 Timeline

- **Opening of submissions:** 16 March
- **Closing of submissions:** 5 April
- **Jury evaluation period:** from 6 April to 19 April
- **Announcement of results:** 22 April, on Earth Day

Article 5 – Jury and Evaluation Criteria

The jury will ideally consist of **one representative from each project partner**, with no direct connection to the participating groups.

The videos will be evaluated according to the following criteria:

- Scientific relevance
- Educational clarity
- Originality
- Quality of production
- Compliance with the format and the rules

For each criterion, 0 to 5 points will be assigned (for a maximum of 25 points in total)

The jury's decisions are final and cannot be appealed.

Article 6 – Prizes

1st Prize

A fully funded trip to a national park located in the winning team's country.

2nd Prize

A geology kit for each of the 4 or 5 team members, enabling them to conduct their own experiments.



3rd Prize

A one-year subscription to a scientific magazine specialised in geology or a related field, such as National Geographic.

Prizes may not be exchanged for cash or other alternatives.

Article 7 – Image Rights and Use of Videos

Participants authorise the Organisers to use and disseminate the submitted videos for communication and promotion purposes related to the Hui-World project (website, social media, events, educational materials), unless otherwise stated in writing.

Participants guarantee that all content used (images, music, text) complies with copyright and image rights regulations. Submitted videos are subject to a CC BY license without commercializing rights for the Hui-World project.

Article 8 – Liability

The Organisers cannot be held responsible for technical issues preventing the submission of a video.

They reserve the right to modify, postpone or cancel the contest if circumstances require it.

Article 9 – Data Protection

Personal data collected within the framework of the contest will be used solely for its organisation and for communicating the results, in accordance with applicable data protection regulations.
